# **Updates**

**Survey results** Last year, we sent out a survey to gauge where we as a department are at regarding OS. **We joined OSCA!** The <u>Open Science Community Amsterdam</u> is an OS platform that encompasses the three big educational institutions in Amsterdam, the UvA, the VU, and the HvA, as well as the Student Initiative for Open Science (SIOS). What's next? After the summer break, we will be organizing our first workshop, re-introducing open science in each group separately. In the meantime, we will work on obtaining some grants.
